# HEIGHTEN Study Overview

HEIGHTEN involves home-based upper limb therapy for babies and toddlers who have a less preferred hand/arm. Each child's caregiver delivers therapy, supported by weekly visits with their therapy team. Participants complete:







The study is investigating whether the therapy is feasible and effective for achieving hand function goals and for improving use of the less preferred hand/arm.



- Calgary exceeded the recruitment target of 10 children, and Edmonton is approaching 10.
