

**PEDIATRIC ORTHOPEDIC SURGEON
ALBERTA CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL**

The Department of Surgery, Alberta Health Services – Calgary Zone and the University of Calgary invite applications for a locum position as a Pediatric Orthopedic Surgeon at the Alberta Children's Hospital (ACH). Qualifications include an MD, completion of an orthopedic residency program, Fellowship of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in orthopedic surgery, and special competency in Pediatric Orthopedics. Applicants must be eligible for licensure in the province of Alberta.

The successful candidate will be joining a group of 6 dynamic and supportive colleagues who provide a wide base of subspecialty expertise. The ACH is a large tertiary hospital with an extensive catchment area and excellent referral base. Clinical duties would include fracture and miscellaneous clinics, on-call coverage, and regular operating room allocation. As this is an academic and teaching practice, the locum will be involved in working with residents, medical students, and clinical assistants, and participating in educational rounds. Appointment to the Cumming School of Medicine, University of Calgary will be expected.

In accordance with Canadian immigration requirements, priority will be given to Canadian citizens and permanent residents of Canada. Alberta Health Services and the University of Calgary are committed to employment equity.
