TARRANT News & Updates

Greetings Sentinels,

Spring has sprung - and with the weather beginning to warm up, we are seeing changes in the viruses circulating in our community.

The season so far

Cases of respiratory infection seen by sentinel physicians in the community have been steadily decreasing since the peak in January. Influenza A was the most common infection this season, with mixed H1N1 and H3N2. We are now seeing an increase in Influenza B cases, as typically occurs in the late season. COVID-19 cases have declined steadily since their peak in the fall. Entero/rhinovirus cases dropped over January and February, with a slight increase in March, along with metapneumovirus. There is an unusual long and late peak in Respiratory Syncytial Virus, which usually only has a short peak around Christmas and New Year (Figure 1, Table 1).


