

Pediatric Emergency Department (ED) Visits Total ED Visits by Site for Fiscal Year 2022/2023



Admissions from ACH Emergency Room by CTAS Score






RESEARCH ACTIVITY 2022-2023 DATA AND METRICS

The following data provides a snapshot of the ongoing success of our community of researchers across all disciplines for the fiscal year 2023.

Furthermore, numerous members of the Department of Pediatrics are actively part of <u>One Child Every Child</u>, an Alberta-led initiative that is set to transform child health research in Canada by promoting Indigenous-led knowledge creation and self-determination, driving discovery and innovation, and building the foundation for global excellence and leadership in research to help every child and community thrive. The initiative is supported by the Canada First Research Excellence Fund, who made a historic \$125M research investment in Alberta's child health and wellness research community in March 2023.


