Excellent or Excrement: Beginner's Guide to Sorting Out Research Claims July 2019

Danielle Perry, Mike Kolber, and other PEER Team members

In this highly interactive workshop, participants will learn from PEER team members to confidently review clinical papers and understand key evidence-based medicine principles. Focusing on randomized controlled trials and systematic reviews, participants will learn how to understand meta-analyzed results as well as methods of quickly appraising articles for quality and usability. Mathematical concepts such as relative and absolute risks, and numbers needed to treat will be explained and practiced. Finally, tips for efficiently navigating the health literature will also be discussed. The overall goal of the workshop is to teach common misinterpretations in evidence, tricks to quickly sort out key findings, and make using evidence less overwhelming.

OATrageously Rewarding Medicine – Treating Opioid Use Disorder in Primary Care

Tina Korownyk, Jessica Kirkwood, and other PEER Team members

This highly interactive workshop focuses on the practical and evidence-based approach to management of opioid use disorder (OUD), through the utilization of the 2019 PEER Simplified Guideline: Managing Opioid Use Disorder in Primary Care. Primary care professionals will learn methods to initiate shared and informed decision- making with their patients regarding initiation of opioid agonist therapy within their practice. Additionally, psychosocial supports, tapering of therapy, and management strategies (i.e. urine drug testing and contracts) will be discussed.

These workshops have both pre- and post-conference homework to be completed.
