This half-day pre-course includes legal multi-disciplinary case reviews, as well as workshops on how to conduct a sexual assault examination and physician expert testimony preparation.

COURSE OVERVIEW

This course is designed to share core training and a management update for urban and rural healthcare professionals on sexual assault.

Topics covered will include sexual assault forensic kits, trauma informed care, chronic pelvic pain, male and transgender sexual health, sexually transmitted infections, strangulation and human trafficking.

Featuring

Jane Doe – an author, educator, activist and litigant in the law suit Jane Doe v the Toronto Police in which they were found guilty of negligence and discrimination in their sexual assault investigations. Her case is taught in law schools internationally, as is her book "The Story of Jane Doe" (Random House 2004). Jane Doe's original research into what she calls the "fugitive pieces" of sexual assault



examines the publication ban, police warnings, the language of rape and the use and efficacy of the sexual assault evidence kit. She has received numerous awards for her work including two doctorates in law. Jane Doe is committed to the use of art as a tool in her work and to the intersections of race, colonialism and sexism in deconstructing sexual violence.

Dr Tracy Pickett – a specialist in both Emergency Medicine and Clinical Forensic Medicine (Clinical Forensic Medicine is medicine at the interface of the law as applied to living patients). She is an emergency physician at the Level 1 trauma centre in Vancouver, Canada, the Medical Director for the BC Women's Hospital Sexual Assault Service, and is also a physician at the Vancouver City Jail.



She is past-president of the Medical Legal Society of British Columbia, and is a member of the roster of experts at the International Criminal Court in the Netherlands. Dr Pickett is a Clinical Professor at the University of British Columbia, Faculty of Medicine, and is currently the only physician in North America to hold both an academic degree (Master of Forensic Medicine, Monash) and Fellowship (FFCFM(RCPA)) in Clinical Forensic Medicine.
