## **Learner Resources Needs Assessment – Program Directors and Teaching Faculty:**

Dear Key Stakeholder,

I am part of a research team that is exploring the extent and nature of needs of program directors, teaching faculty and residents to facilitate effective and optimal resident remediation.

This is a survey provided through Qualtrics at the University of Calgary that will collect information to explore the needs and perceptions of residency program directors, teaching faculty and residents regarding resident remediation and struggling learners.
