PROCEDURES FOR PHYSICIAN RE-ENTRY

Eligibility:

Any physician practicing in Alberta who wishes to re-enter residency training, is eligible to apply.

There is no funding available for re-entry in subspecialty programs. Funding is available only for core specialty programs. Re-entry trainees are not eligible to participate in the CaRMS Medicine or Pediatric subspecialty matches.

Note: Applicants wishing to enter R3 Enhanced Skills programs must:

- o have proof of CFPC certification.
- have completed core training at least 6 months prior to application.

Selection Criteria:

Selection criteria include, but are not limited to, length of continuous practice in Alberta, physician resource need, funding availability, residency program capacity, program director approval, academic excellence, and references.

- Under exceptional circumstances, out of province applicants will be accepted for review.
- Re-entry positions are funded under the Ministry Flexible Funding Stream and cannot be funded by external sources.
- These positions must not be in competition with trainees entering through R1 and R3 CaRMS matches, or selection processes for graduating residents to R3 or subspecialty positions.

Application Process:

- 1. The applicant contacts the Program Director of the training program that they wish to enter for program specific application and assessment procedures.
- 2. The Program Director contacts the PGME to request funding approval.
- 3. The Allocations Committee meets to review program submissions to support funding requests for re-entry positions
- 4. If funding is approved by the Allocations Committee, the program evaluates applicant suitability for a training position based on program-specific criteria including, but not limited to:
 - a. A personal statement of interest
 - b. References
 - c. Interview
- 5. The program communicates its recommendation regarding the applicant to the Associate Dean, PGME.
- 6. If the program does not support the application the Program Director will advise the applicant directly.
- 7. A recommendation to accept the applicant is dependent on PGME approval.

8. If approved, the program will inform the applicant directly and PGME will provide a formal Letter of Engagement.
