## **Opportunities and Award Nominations**

The Equity in Health Systems (EqHS) Lab is piloting a Equity, Diversity, Inclusivity and Accessibility Self-Assessment Tool designed to help primary care health professionals reflect and identify both strengths and areas for continued professional development related to health equity and social justice in their care practices. The pilot study involves the completion of general demographic questions, and 24 reflective questions on the topic of Access to Care, Indigenous Health, Disability, Ableism, and Accessibility, and Anti-Racism & Discrimination. If you are a health professional currently practising in Canada please consider completing the tool – it will take approximately 45 minutes.

Resident physicians in the AHS Calgary Zone are invited to participate in a **research study exploring resident perceptions of the construct of 'Just Culture'**, (a concept and process where organizations aim to respond to adverse events by identifying the root cause of the event rather than placing blame on the individuals involved in the event.) Those participating will take part in a 60-minute focus group discussion. More details here

UCalgary's Indigenous Research Support Team coordinates an **Indigenous Research** Community of Practice for Indigenous and non-Indigenous academics to network, connect, and create capacity within our campus, discussing topics such as mentorship, university processes, and sharing of research projects and initiatives. The <u>Call for Proposals</u> for UCalgary's Taylor Institute of Teaching and Learning's annual <u>Conference on Post Secondary Teaching and Learning</u> is now open. Community members from UCalgary and beyond are invited to submit proposals, including academic staff, postdoctoral scholars, graduate students and staff for sessions, research discussions, roundtables, and poster sessions. The theme this year is *Reassessing Assessment*, exploring how student assessment has shifted in recent years, and why integrating ethical uses of technology, transparency, student and instructor wellbeing, and ongoing research on assessment is critical to the advancement of postsecondary education. Deadline for proposals is Jan. 6, 2025.

The **University of Calgary Teaching and Learning Grants** fund innovative research projects that support student learning experiences, advance post-secondary goals, and develop educational leadership.
