The <u>Call for Proposals</u> for UCalgary's Taylor Institute of Teaching and Learning's annual <u>Conference on Post Secondary Teaching and Learning</u> is now open. First described in 1997, **DARVO** (deny, attack, and reverse victim and offender), is a strategy where a perpetrator of harassment denies the alleged actions, turns the attack toward their victim, and then assumes the role of the victim.
