Opportunities and Award Nominations

Nominate your colleagues for **UCalgary's 2025 Equity, Diversity and Inclusion Awards**. UCalgary's Indigenous Research Support Team coordinates an **Indigenous Research** Community of Practice for Indigenous and non-Indigenous academics to network, connect, and create capacity within our campus, discussing topics such as mentorship, university processes, and sharing of research projects and initiatives. The Canadian Medical Protective Association (CMPA) has introduced an **Equity Scholarship** to cover registration fees to attend the **2025 International Congress on Academic Medicine (ICAM)** in Halifax, NS from Apr. 3-6. The scholarship aims to help increase the ability of individuals from equity-deserving groups to contribute their research and enhance their knowledge in healthcare. Physicians and physician trainees who self-identify as Black, Indigenous, or racialized participants and are currently training or practicing in Canada are encouraged to <u>apply</u>, by the Dec. 13 deadline.

Applications are open until Jan. 31, 2025 for **UCalgary's Indigenous Curriculum Grants Program**, with up to \$10,000 to support initiatives that will advance Indigenous engagement and Indigenous perspectives in the curriculum. More details here

The Equity in Health Systems (EqHS) Lab is piloting a **Equity, Diversity, Inclusivity and Accessibility Self-Assessment Tool** designed to help primary care health professionals reflect and identify both strengths and areas for continued professional development related to health equity and social

justice in their care practices. The pilot study involves the completion of general demographic questions, and 24 reflective questions on the topic of Access to Care, Indigenous Health, Disability, Ableism, and Accessibility, and Anti-Racism & Discrimination. If you are a health professional currently practising in Canada please consider completing the tool – it will take approximately 45 minutes.
