The Equity in Health Systems (EqHS) Lab is piloting a Equity, Diversity, Inclusivity and Accessibility Self-Assessment Tool designed to help primary care health professionals reflect and identify both strengths and areas for continued professional development related to health equity and social justice in their care practices. Resources:

The Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR) recently released their <u>From Intention to Impact: CIHR Anti-Ableism Action Plan</u>, indicating the commitment of CIHR to actions that address barriers experienced by persons with disabilities who interact with CIHR. The goal of this action plan is for CIHR and the health research community to be safer and more welcoming places for persons with disabilities.

Medscape surveyed Canadian physicians across more than 30 specialties about their experiences of **sexual harassment in the workplace** over the past 3 years. This <u>article</u> breaks down the study's results, including that 9% indicated that they had personally experienced sexual abuse, harassment, or misconduct at their workplace, and another 9% had witnessed this behaviour.

This open source article, <u>More Than Personal Communication: Templates for Citing Indigenous Elders and Knowledge</u> <u>Keepers</u>, provides guidance on citing unrecorded oral teachings of Indigenous people, for APA and MLA styles.
