Upcoming EDI-related Courses and Conferences:

Apr. 24, 9:00am – 2:00pm MT: The UCalgary Accessibility Network and the Institutes for Transdisciplinary Scholarship are hosting an in-person Accessible Cities and Societies Showcase where researchers, government representatives, community members, and practitioners can come together to share their work, experiences and visions for accessible urban environments that transcend disciplinary and sector boundaries.

Apr. 28 – 30: Registration is now open for the UCalgary Taylor Institute for Teaching and Learning's <u>Conference on Postsecondary Learning and Teaching</u>. This year's theme, *Reassessing Assessment in Postsecondary Education Assessment*, will focus on assessment strategies that are meaningful, equitable, and engaging learning experiences.

Apr. 29: The Health Data Research Network Canada (HDRN) presents its annual public forum, <u>Health Data for All of Us: a Public Dialogue on Al in Health</u>. The 2025 event takes place in Ottawa (small registration fee) and online (free) and will focus on exploring key ethical, equity and privacy challenges in the context of artificial intelligence and health, particularly health data.

May 2 – June 20: Registration is now open for the UCalgary Taylor Institute' Anti-racism in Teaching and Learning Badge Program. This hybrid course explores white supremacy, intersectionality, and racism as a system of oppression within postsecondary teaching and learning to help participants develop an anti-racist lens in their pedagogy. Using critical race theory as a conceptual framework, participants will examine anti-racist pedagogies by interrogating the role of white supremacy in perpetuating oppression, followed by applied learning around taking an explicitly anti-racist approach to course development and design. Registration deadline: April 25.

May 7 & 8: UCalgary staff, faculty and learners are invited to participate in <u>First Responder to Sexual Assault and Abuse Training™</u>. This comprehensive training place over Zoom. It will build the capacity of all UCalgary community members to assess and respond effectively to disclosures of sexual assault and sexual abuse.

May 22: The CSM O'Brien Institute for Public Health's Centre for Health Policy and Health Policy Trials Unit will bring together researchers, community organizations, and health leaders to explore Evidence in Action: Community-driven interventions for better health policies for a free in-person event at the UCalgary Downtown Campus.

May 29, June 5 & June 12: The CSM Office of Faculty Development is hosting a 3 part online workshop on Reconciliation Leadership Foundations for CSM faculty leaders and aspiring leaders. Led by Dr. Pam Roach, this series of 3-hour sessions is intended to enable current and future leaders in health to transform ways of being, connecting, and doing in the hopes of catalyzing systemic change.
