The US National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine has published proceedings of a workshop on the <u>Intersection of Regenerative Medicine and Women's Health</u>. The report reviews consider gaps within regenerative medicine research related to conditions that are female-specific and/or are more common in or differently impact women, explores emerging regenerative medicine therapies and technologies, and identifies obstacles and opportunities related to regenerative medicine therapies and women's health.
