May 15 is <u>Moose Hide Campaign Day</u>, a day of ceremony where all Canadians are called to join together to take a stand against violence towards women and children and to take practical steps for our collective journey of reconciliation.

May 17 is International Day Against Homophobia, Transphobia, and Biphobia. This day honours the resilience and strength of members of the 2S/LGBTQ+ community, and draws attention to the violence, hate, and discrimination experienced by Two-Spirit, lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, intersex, and gender-diverse people. This <u>article in The Conversation discusses the myths of meritocracy</u>, pointing out the plasticity of merit, and how the criteria of excellence may be unconsciously redefined to fit a person from a dominant group.

University Affairs published an article, <u>Women's Representation and Compensation in Full-time Faculty Positions</u>, analyzing data from Canadian universities from 1970-2022. The data shows that, despite increases in women's representation in the university sector over the past 50 years, and the fact that women comprise the majority of university graduates, women are still underrepresented in academia.
