June is National Indigenous History Month, an opportunity to learn about the rich history and diversity of First Nations, Inuit and Métis peoples. Learn more about the history, languages, culture, and experiences of these peoples on this website, check out this interactive map of Indigenous territories across the world and delve deeper with the associated links, explore the National Film Board's online collection of <u>Indigenous-made films</u>, and take (or retake) the UAlberta <u>Indigenous Canada</u> online course to learn the histories and contemporary perspectives of Indigenous peoples living in Canada.

Here are some of the special events planned for National Indigenous History Month:

- June 10, 11:00am 12:00pm MT: The Canadian Centre for Diversity and Inclusion is presenting the first of a twopart webinar series, *Ten years of Truth, a Lifetime of Action*. Part one focuses on <u>Prioritizing Indigenous Justice</u> with Action and Accountability as Non-Indigenous Settler Peoples. The webinar will discuss the principles of living allyship and actionable steps that drive meaningful change, setting the stage for continued dialogue and reflection in part two of the series. The National Collaborating Centre for Indigenous Health has recently published a fact sheet providing an <u>Overview of</u> <u>First Nations, Inuit, and Métis Health in Canada</u>.
