**Sept. 27 & 28**: The <u>Federation of Medical Women of Canada's 2025 Educational Conference and AGM</u> takes place in Toronto, with the theme *Women Physicians Empowering for Change*. Plenary themes include diversity & inclusion, sexual & reproductive rights, and support & mentorship.

The Canadian Medical Protective Association (CMPA) has <u>Equity Scholarships</u> to cover registration fees to attend two upcoming conferences: the <u>International Conference on Residency Education</u> (Oct 30 – Nov. 1) in Quebec City and the <u>Family Medicine Forum</u> (Nov. 5-8) in Winnipeg. Physicians and physician trainees who are currently training or practicing in Canada, and who self-identify as Black, Indigenous (First Nations, Inuit and Métis) or racialized, are encouraged to apply by the respective Aug. 29 & Sept. 15 deadlines.

McGill University's Centre for Genomics and Policy have launched an introductory guide for healthcare providers, <u>Towards</u> <u>Affirmative Intersex Health Communication in Canada</u>. The guide is a primer for healthcare providers interested in learning about accessible, supportive, and inclusive health communication with intersex patients within the Canadian context. Content was shaped by interviews with intersex adults and healthcare providers from diverse areas of care, as well as a comprehensive literature review.
