Funding applications are now open for Heritage Canada's Anti-Hate Call that funds initiatives to address and prevent hate in Canada to empower communities to prevent and address hate by fostering inclusion, resilience, and unity through community-led, intersectional projects that will contribute to reducing social isolation and fragmentation, and reinforce collective identity, building a more inclusive, socially cohesive and united Canada.
