Dr. Kendra Nixon is an associate professor in the Faculty of Social Work at the University of Manitoba and is also the Director of RESOLVE Manitoba, a tri-prairie research network on family and gender-based violence. Dr. Nixon's research has primarily focused on policies aimed at reducing violence, as well as institutional responses to intimate partner violence, including the child welfare and criminal justice systems. Dr. Nixon's teaching interests include social welfare policy, policy analysis, and qualitative research.

Dr. Nicole Letourneau is a professor in the Faculty of Nursing and Cumming School of Medicine at the University of Calgary. She is also the Principal Investigator of the CHILD Studies program, the director of RESOLVE Alberta, and holds a Research Chair in Parent and Child Mental Health. Her research focuses on understanding how parental mental health, violence and adversity affect children's health and creating and testing relevant community-based interventions to promote children's health.

Dr. Lubna Anis is a foreign-trained physician, PhD, and a post-doctoral fellow at the University of Calgary. Her background is in clinical medicine and project management and she is also well-trained in administering various standardized measures to assess Parent-Child relationships, child health and development. Her research interests include Parent-Child relationships, immune health, and child health and development.
