

KEY FEATURES:

Review this list prior to starting an EPA

Specifies what the resident MUST DO independently to be competent in this task
Specifies what the resident is NOT EXPECTED to be doing independently at this stage



OBSERVATION SCORE:

This is NOT a pass or fail score

If the resident completed all items listed in the key features independently and achieved all the milestones, they should be considered competent.

If rated not yet competent (I had to do....I needed to prompt), support your rating using the milestones that were not achieved or how you had to support the resident complete the task



MILESTONES:

Use this as a checklist for all the steps required to be competent in the EPA

"Achieved": the milestone was observed by you to be completed independently

"In Progress": the milestone was observed by you to be started, but not to completion without help/support

"Not Observed": the milestone was not seen by you or the step was completely missed by the resident



NARRATIVE FEEDBACK:

The most helpful and important part - Feedback and coaching to the resident!

Support your 'Observation Score' by explaining what was done well, what milestones are in progress/not observed and what the resident can do to work towards competence in this task
