Frequently Asked Questions

1. I have never signed up for small group. What is it all about?

Small group sessions are case-based learning sessions run by students, and guided by preceptors. Preceptors will receive detailed notes outlining the case and highlighting important learning points to be covered.

2. What is the commitment?

Preceptors sign up for as many small group sessions as they would like to do. Each session is approximately 2 hours in length. Generally, preparation time is approximately 1 hour per session.

3. How is it organized?

Once you are confirmed as a small group facilitator, you will be contacted by our Course Coordinator, or Course Chair. A preceptor package will be sent to you before the session, which goes through the details of the case. A pre-assigned student will lead the session and guide the discussion. As a facilitator, you will need to ensure the discussions are accurate, and provide any further medical expert information that the students do not cover in their discussions.
