

The Department of Pediatrics is undertaking a strategic planning process. We want to ensure that the strategic plan is meaningful, actionable and reflective of the Department as a whole.


Please take a few minutes to fill out the survey via the link here.


Dr. Jennifer deBruyn (Section of Pediatric Gastroenterology) is the first author on a new publication in *The American Journal of Gastroenterology:*

Adalimumab versus Infliximab in Luminal Pediatric Crohn's Disease: Comparable Outcomes in a Prospective Multicenter Cohort Study


Dr. deBruyn is also the current co-chair for the Canadian Children Inflammatory Bowel Disease (IBD) Network who performed this study.

Outcomes at 1 year




