

Measles Has Landed!

The global resurgence of measles has arrived at our borders in 2024, involving several provinces particularly a growing outbreak in Quebec. Some families are returning from out of province travel, others are planning for upcoming Spring Break so there will be many opportunities for measles exposures. Please ensure that you have had **2 documented doses of measles-containing vaccine** or have a positive measles lgG. This will ensure you are considered immune and able to work even if you are exposed to measles.

Vaccines are our best defense! Encourage all patients/families to ensure measles vaccines are up to date; they can call 811 or their local public health unit to book an appointment.
