

World Autism Day, April 2, 2025

Autism "awareness" day is a time to highlight the importance of autism within our society. Since most people are aware that autism exists, there is a movement to rename it "Autism Acceptance Day". The purpose of the "acceptance" is to acknowledge that autistic individuals are present throughout all walks of society and are often overlooked, ignored, bullied or have to hide their true selves in order to fit in and be successful.

This masking of the individual leads to increased mental health concerns and significantly increases the suicide rate among autistics who have a normal or above normal IQ. Data from one study in 2023 revealed that ~34% of autistics have experienced suicidal ideation, 22% have made plans and 24 % have had at least one suicide attempt. Acceptance of autistic behaviours as being normal (they are after all, human behaviours) would allow for autistic members of society to feel more comfortable being themselves and reduce this mental health burden.

Autism Acceptance Day is an opportunity for everyone to reflect on their own biases. A common bias is the belief that the only "right way" to communicate is through spoken word. For many autistic individuals, including those who are highly verbal, spoken language is not their preferred form of communication. There is research showing that adult autistics can temporarily lose their ability to speak when they are unwell, stressed or tired. Why then, do we insist on teaching children to speak, yet not pair this with also teaching them alternate communication methods? The answer is clear; because the rest of the population speaks so this must be the "best" approach to communication for everyone. A second example would be the insistence on quiet hands when listening. For those who need to fidget when someone is speaking to them, having to focus on keeping their hands still can mean that they are unable to understand what they are being told. Autistics are famous for being inflexible, but in these situations, who is the individual being forced to be flexible, and who is being rigid?

While Autism Awareness Day is not celebrated with parties, cakes and gifts, it is an important day for everyone to think about how we interact with the autistic individuals in our own lives.

Dr. Novak Receives 2025 Early Career Pediatrician Award

Dr. Novak has been selected to receive the 2025 Early Career Pediatrician Award from the Canadian Pediatric Society. This award recognizes pediatricians with fewer than 10 years of practice for their exceptional contributions to the health of children and youth at the local level, particularly in patient care, teaching and education, and community service.

Dr. Novak has earned numerous accolades from patients and their families for his outstanding care. As the medical lead for equipment and procedures, he has significantly improved anxiolysis and sedation services for patients, utilized point-of-care ultrasound (POCUS) as an adjunct to bedside clinical assessments, and implemented heated humidified high flow outside the pediatric intensive care unit (PICU) for patients with severe bronchiolitis.

He is also a passionate medical educator with a master's degree in medical education. Dr. Novak is a pre-clerkship curriculum developer and instructor at the University of Calgary's Cumming School of Medicine, an esteemed preceptor for medical students, residents, and fellows during clinical service, and the creator of a free open-access website offering educational resources in pediatrics, including podcasts, videos, and infographics.

In addition, Dr. Novak dedicates many hours to volunteer work with Kamp Kiwanis, which provides camping programs for underprivileged and disadvantaged children in the Calgary area. He currently serves on their board of directors.
