# International Day for Women and Girls of African Descent July 25, 2025

The International Day for Women and Girls of African Descent is observed every year on July 25th, following its declaration by the United Nations General Assembly in 2021.

The purpose of this day is to recognize and celebrate the contributions and resilience of women and girls of African descent across the globe. In doing so, the goal is to call attention to the injustices and systemic barriers they have historically and continue to face due to legacies of colonialism, enslavement, and racial discrimination.

Women and girls of African descent often experience multiple and intersecting forms of discrimination, including racism, sexism, and socio-economic marginalization. These inequities impact access to quality healthcare, education, employment, justice, and political representation. Yet, despite these injustices, women and girls of African descent continue to lead, innovate, and shape movements for justice, equity, and human rights around the world.

### How Does Our Community Address This Day?

In Canada and globally, communities mark this day by centering the voices of women and girls of African descent and celebrating their heritage, achievements, and leadership across all domains of excellence. The day also serves as a moment to reflect on systemic persistent racial and gender-based inequalities and commit to personal concrete action.

Various events are organized at the government, public and grassroots level, encouraging discussion surrounding dismantling systemic racism, promoting cultural pride, and amplifying the voices of African women and girls.

The theme for 2025 is "Recognition, Justice, and Development", which echos the pillars of the UN International Decade for People of African Descent (2015–2024), which continues to guide efforts toward equity and inclusion.

# How Does the Department of Pediatrics Support Women and Girls of African Descent?

As healthcare professionals, we should recognize our role in addressing racial and

gender inequities in child and adolescent health. African girls and young women may face:

- Disparities in access to care and developmental screening
- Stereotyping and bias in clinical settings
- Invisibility in health research and policy
- Barriers to mental health support rooted in stigma or cultural mismatch

### We should all be committed to:

- Providing culturally safe, trauma-informed care
- Be aware of our personal biases in language, attitudes, and behavior towards all marginalized groups of people
- Fostering mentorship and representation within our department
- Supporting community-led initiatives that uplift and empower African youth

By listening, learning, and acting, we can help create spaces where women and girls of African descent are supported to thrive — with dignity, voice, and full human rights.

### Reporting in MySafetyNet

Medical staff can now submit a workplace hazard or incident report directly in MySafetyNet (MSN). Some of the incidents you can report include work-related psychological or physical injuries and illnesses. incidents involving harassment or violence (including aggression), workplace hazards and no-injury or near miss incidents.

Safety reports you submit will automatically be sent to the Medical Affairs MSN Intake Coordinator, ensuring they are immediately seen and addressed by the right people, reinforcing leadership involvement and making sure you are heard and supported. Workplace safety incidents and hazards are not reported anonymously. When reporting in MSN, you will be required to log into the system using your AHS credentials (your network log in).






### **Physician Affairs Team Lead Retirement**


