## Inpatient/PCCU Team Instructions



	Review admitted patients to confirm if they are a PRoMPT BOLUS participant. Identify fluid allocation on patient IV hang tags.
	<ul> <li>Documents and treatment assignment are colour coded</li> </ul>
	<ul><li>Orange = 0.9% Normal Saline (NS)</li></ul>
	<ul> <li>Green = Balanced Fluid (BF: Lactated Ringers or PlasmaLyte)</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Keep coloured IV hang tag with the patient</li> </ul>
	Order fluids in Connect Care for ALL boluses and maintenance fluid required
	through 23:59 on the calendar day following randomization:
	<ul> <li>Please order the fluid TYPE specified by randomization (NS or BF)</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li><u>Note:</u> Hypotonic fluids (i.e. 0.45NS) are not considered appropriate for bolus</li> </ul>
	or maintenance fluids in septic children and should be avoided
	<ul> <li>When and how much fluid should be decided based on clinical need</li> </ul>
	by the clinical care team
	<ul> <li>Obtain fluids from clinical inventory</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Additives (i.e. Dextrose, KCI) can be used as needed</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Document <u>ALL IV and IO fluid given</u> to the patient during this time</li> </ul>
	During patient transfer of care/handover verbally inform the receiving team that the child
	is participating in the PRoMPT BOLUS study
	<ul> <li>Inpatient/PCCU teams should continue to order the allocated study fluid TYPE (NS or BF)</li> </ul>
	through 23:59 on the calendar day following randomization
	<ul> <li>Keep coloured IV hang tag with the patient</li> </ul>
