

### CIHR ADDRESSING THE WIDER HEALTH IMPACTS OF COVID-19

While the direct impacts of COVID-19, variants of concern, and vaccination have been prioritized in the short term, so too should research on the wider impacts of the pandemic so that evidence-informed practices and policies can be implemented at the earliest possible time. The disruption to the economy, education, social relationships and health care have been harmful and severe, causing substantial suffering, mortality and potential lifelong impacts. These wider impacts are frequently more challenging to observe, catalogue and address because they fall across a much broader spectrum of services, as well often being longer term and/or harder to specifically establish attribution. Without focused attention, these major consequences are likely to remain poorly understood, impact the health of people in Canada, and create a significant lag in evidence-informed practices and policies.

**IMPORTANT:** Given the short timelines for CIHR COVID-19 funding opportunities ALL interested applicants are asked to contact <u>Clint Westgard</u>. The Grant Development Office will work with applicants to ensure they complete all necessary tasks and meet both the CIHR deadlines and internal deadlines.

- Registration deadline: October 18 at 6pm (No Internal Approvals)
- RSO Internal Deadline Nov 3 at noon (RMS and Full Application)
- · Notice of Decision: February 2021

### Value and Term

- Clinical Trial or RCT: Up to \$1M over two years
- All other research: Up to \$500K over two years
- It is expected that most budgets be lower than these maximums
- The total funding envelope for this and upcoming COVID-19 competitions is approximately \$88M. The amount invested in this competition will not be the full amount and will depend on the number and quality, as assessed by peer review, of applications received.

# Application:

- 5 Pages for all non-clinical trial applications
- · 6 pages for clinical trials/RCT
- EDI plan (1 page)

### **Objectives**

Applications must address all objectives and one Research Area.

- Understand the extent and impact of the indirect and wider health consequences of COVID-19 and the resilience of people of Canada
- Identify effective interventions (policy, practice and/or models of care) to ameliorate the wider impacts of COVID-19 and improve preparedness for future health emergencies and pandemics
- Generate evidence related to one or more marginalized population(s), including for instance: communities marginalized by race; First Nations, Inuit, Métis and Urban Indigenous Peoples; communities historically excluded from research; those experiencing health inequity; persons with disabilities and individuals across diverse health status (e.g. high risk populations, individuals with

comorbid conditions); those experiencing gendered impacts of the pandemic; and those in life stages that have been underrepresented in research (e.g. pregnant people, children, older adults). Across all populations, researchers are encouraged to consider a lifecycle approach (from preconception to older adulthood).

### Research Areas:

- The impact of deferred/displaced care due to the COVID-19 pandemic on health
- The impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on social, economic and population issues as well as the public health outcomes
- Exacerbation of existing disparities among marginalized populations (including Indigenous Peoples; individuals marginalized by race, gender, disability; age; individuals experiencing homelessness; prisoner populations; African Caribbean and Black population in Canada; etc.)

# COVID-19 VACCINATION CLINICS IN HIGH IMPACT LOCATIONS

How work-site and geographically chosen COVID-19 vaccination clinics helped vulnerable populations

Earlier this year, Dr. Gabriel Fabreau was part of a team who coordinated vaccination clinics at local area meat plants and heavily impacted geographical areas in NE Calgary. As soon as a call for volunteer vaccinators went out, there was a great uptake of Department of Medicine members who came out to help.

Dr. Fabreau's involvement started back at the beginning of the pandemic, where he worked collaboratively with Dr. Coakley (Medical Director of the Refugee Clinic). Dr. Fabreau and Dr. Coakley co-direct and co-founded a research program refugeehealthyyc. ca.

Last April during the outbreak at the

Cargill meat plant, the Medical Officer of Health reached out to Dr. Coakley. Dr. Coakley was able to connect with community partners to assist in helping manage the outbreak. Dr. Fabreau led the operational and CIHR-funded research side of the project. Dr. Fabreau and Dr. Coakley became part of the AHS Public Health COVID Meat Processing Plant Task Force. Every time there was an outbreak at a meat processing plant (Cargill, JBS, Harmony, Olymel), they would get called in to help provide advice around operations and how to effectively respond. Dr. Coakley was responsible

for community engagement, whereas Dr. Fabreau was responsible for the state of science.

Meat processing plants were identified early in the pandemic as one of the highest risk environments for COVID transmission, including associated community spread in an unvaccinated population. Meat plant workers are a very vulnerable group, with the majority being newcomers who tend to be disempowered and have low agency. The team's recommendations included that meat processing plants be a priority for vaccinations (and rapid vaccination) for multiple reasons. JBS, Cargill and Harmony combined account for 75-80% of Canada's beef supply, and therefore are considered critical infrastructure for the National food supply. Any outbreaks would also have a major impact on the health system, given the associated spread through the community. It was decided that the best way to facilitate vaccinations and remove barriers would be on-site vaccination clinics, accompanied by community engagement and involvement of community agencies, unions and employers prior to hosting the clinic. The first round of on-site vaccinations included 3100 workers from 4 meat plants in the AHS Calgary zone. The first dose clinics saw 81% uptake and the second dose clinics

reported over 80% uptake.

The community rapid vaccination clinics were built on the "Hockey Hub" model for efficiency. This model was presented to government during the third wave, at a time when the population living in the North East part of Calgary (lowest incomes, frontline essential workers and not vaccinated) were experiencing high rates of COVID-19 infection. This model was proposed in an effort to offer low barrier community clinics within this area. Government approval was received on May 31, 2021 and the clinic popped up 5 days later for first dose vaccinations. The clinic was able to vaccinate 2260 first doses in 2 days to an 80% self-identifying visible minority group. Almost 40% of people had attempted to get a vaccination appointment earlier but couldn't. The model was efficient with a 99% satisfaction rate and an average 3 minute wait time.

Dr. Fabreau highlighted the importance of all the volunteers from the Department and re-iterated that, after caring for hospitalized patients with COVID over 3 waves, it was therapeutic to bond over vaccinating some of the most heavily impacted Albertans. Being able to show up, bring vaccines and protect these communities was a big win for all involved.
