Teaching opportunities (clerkship teaching)

IM clerkship Bedside teaching (BST): 1-3pm every Wednesday at FMC. As a preceptor, you will supervise a group of 4-6 clinical clerks perform select physical examination maneuvers on patients. One clerk is responsible for recruiting patients and leading the session. There is no preparation required for BST. Often there is a focus (eg. volume assessment, cardiac examination, examine for ascites etc)

IM teaching Sessions: Two 1-hour teaching seminars take place every Wednesday (3:15-4:15 and 4:15-5:15). These sessions are held virtually on zoom. 10-17 clerks attend each session. You can teach on a topic of your choice! Teaching topics generally include core Internal Medicine or subspecialty topics that are case-based and high yield for the MCC (Medical Council of Canada) exam.
