FROM DR. CHANDRA THOMAS - DOM PHYSICIAN ADMIN SUPPORT WORKING GROUP




SUPPORT FOR CAREER TRANSITIONS

TERRY FOX NEW INVESTIGATOR AWARD

The Terry Fox New Investigator Award aims to support outstanding new researchers (within 5 years of first faculty-level appointment) as they develop their careers as independent research scientists or clinician scientists to undertake high-quality cancer research, while in close collaboration and mentorship with Canadian cancer research groups.

Support under this Request for Applications (RFA) is targeted at high-quality biomedical, clinical and/or translational research, providing information that may form the basis of innovative cancer prevention, diagnosis and/or treatment. The TFRI is looking for outstanding investigators to be mentored by two or more senior investigators of an established Canadian research group which may be funded by any combination of Federal, Provincial, or private research grants.

GRANT BASICS: HOW TO SUBMIT YOUR RESEARCH GRANT & INTRODUCTION TO THE CANADIAN COMMON CV AND CIHR BIOSKETCH

This two-part webinar will help you (and your staff) submit your research grant application and prepare your CCV without a hitch.

In part one, we will explain what faculty members need to do to submit a research grant to a funding agency. We will guide you through the University of Calgary's internal processes and required approvals, provide tips to avoid common Research Management System (RMS) issues, and explain the general process for submitting your final, approved application to the funding agency.

In part two, we will explain how to create a CV using the Canadian Common CV (CCV) system. We will highlight the main features of the CCV system, explain how to complete the different sections of a CIHR Biosketch, and address frequently asked questions.

SSHRC 2023 INSIGHT GRANT COMPETITION

The SSHRC Insight Grant (Fall 2023) competition has officially launched. Insight Grants support research excellence in the social sciences and humanities. Funding is available for 2 – 5 years in two streams: Stream A (projects less than \$100,000) and Stream B (\$100,000-400,000). The success rate for both streams is typically around 50%.

SSHRC is open to projects with health outcomes, provided the primary outcomes of the study advance knowledge and understanding in social sciences and humanities disciplines. SSHRC supports research that enhances our understanding of modern social, cultural, technological, environmental, economic and wellness issues. Wellness and well-being are frames that have had success at SSHRC, provided your approach uses (and advances knowledge in) social sciences and humanities methodologies.
