NFRF SPECIAL CALL: RESEARCH FOR POST-PANDEMIC RECOVERY COMPETITION

The New Frontiers for Research Fund (NFRF) has indicated it will launch a Special Call in February 2022 titled Research for Post-Pandemic Recovery. This call aims to mobilize Canadian-led research efforts in support of a more equitable, sustainable and resilient post-pandemic reality. Projects will directly address one or more of the research priorities outlined in the UN Research Roadmap for COVID-19 Recovery, supporting a cohesive international research effort to address global socio-economic inequities that have been heightened by the COVID-19 pandemic. Two-year grants will fund up to \$400K in direct costs of research. Research Services will publish additional information regarding this coming opportunity when it is available. PRIHS 7 INFORMATION SESSION

Alberta Innovates, AHS and the Grant Development Office are hosting an information session for University of Calgary researchers on the upcoming Partnership for Research and Innovation in the Health System (PRIHS) 7 competition, which will launch in January 2022. Dr. Eddy Lang will present on behalf of the Strategic Clinical Networks and will share program highlights. Clint Westgard, from the Grant Development Office, will highlight internal timelines and support available for applicants.

The PRIHS is designed to align research with the evidence needs of the health system through projects focused on the **implementation of promising solutions** to priority health system challenges in collaboration with <u>Strategic Clinical Networks</u> (SCNs). Projects should propose solutions that are aligned with <u>SCN priority areas</u> and improve healthcare quality, health outcomes and overall value for Albertans in acute, primary/ambulatory, and/or community-based settings. The upcoming PRIHS 7 competition will focus on **digital health**, defined as the application of technologies to support the delivery of innovative care models that empower patients, families, and their healthcare teams to improve quality of care. Technologies include virtual and augmented reality, mobile-health applications, big data analytics, connected devices, sensors, wearables, 3D printing, and computer simulation and modelling. <u>See the one-pager for more competition details</u>.

EMERGING RESEARCHER AWARDS IN ASTHMA

Asthma is one of the most common chronic respiratory diseases in Canada affecting over 10% of the population (3.8 million people) with well-recognized biological sex differences. Asthma disproportionately affects children and youth and is a leading cause of emergency room visits and hospitalizations in children. Chronic airway inflammation affects the health, wellbeing, and quality of life of individuals and those caring for patients with asthma.

The goal of the <u>Early Career Researcher Award in Asthma</u> is to support and enable Canadian researchers early in their independent research career (less than 84 months into their first academic appointment) to pursue basic, clinical, health services or population health research in the field of asthma.

The Early Career Researcher Awards are expected to:

- Increase Canadian research capacity in the area of asthma
- Support the research career of promising researchers
- Produce high-quality research in asthma
- · Contribute to knowledge mobilization activities

Value: \$200,000 over 2 years
