The Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR) Project Grant program is designed to capture ideas with the greatest potential for advances in fundamental or applied health-related knowledge, health care, health systems, and/or health outcomes by supporting projects of research proposed and conducted by individual researchers or groups of researchers in all areas of health. The best ideas may stem from new, incremental, innovative, and/or high-risk lines of inquiry or knowledge translation approaches.

Registration for the Spring 2023 CIHR Project Grant competition (via ResearchNet) opens on January 11th, 2023.

You put your heart, soul and precious time into your last grant application but weren't funded. What do you do now? Dr. Savraj Grewal, Associate Dean, Research Grants, and Brandi Povitz, Research Grants Development Officer, will discuss the various pathways you can take to get your project funded, the resources available to help you improve your next application and how to craft an effective response to reviewers. Dr. Jennifer Corcoran, Associate Professor in the Department of Microbiology, Immunology and Infectious Diseases, will share how she recently turned an unsuccessful CIHR Project Grant around. While this session will focus on resubmissions to the CIHR Project Grant competition, the strategies that will be discussed can be applied to other grants as well.

The Planning and Dissemination Grants are intended to provide support for planning and/or dissemination activities (either virtual or in-person) consistent with the mandate of CIHR and relevant to CIHR Institutes and Initiatives.

Note: This funding opportunity is not intended to support the direct cost of research (e.g., pilot projects, feasibility studies or operating grants), principal and co-investigator salaries or research equipment. Primary research or primary data collection will not be supported through this funding opportunity. Any activity that may be perceived as such should be justified (e.g., surveying individuals for the purpose of the project).

KRESCENT NEW INVESTIGATOR AWARD

The KRESCENT program New Investigator Award is awarded to individuals who have clearly demonstrated excellence during their pre-doctoral and post-doctoral training in kidney disease. The Award provides salary support for up to three years of the faculty appointment at the rank of Assistant Professor or its equivalent at a Canadian University. Consult your Faculty on this Salary award, as their eligibility requirements for supporting your application may differ from a standard research grant.

TEAM GRANT: CIHR-JDRF TYPE 1 DIABETES SCREENING RESEARCH CONSORTIUM

The goal of the CIHR-JDRF Type 1 Diabetes Screening Research Consortium is to develop a single nationally coordinated research Consortium to explore key research questions pertaining to the feasibility and acceptability of a general population T1D screening program in Canada, building on experiences from other countries.

The Consortium will bring together experts from different disciplines with stakeholder organizations and people affected by T1D including, but not limited to, pediatric clinical endocrinology, T1D research, general population screening, health economics, health policy, representatives from First Nations, Inuit and Métis communities and health authorities/organizations, primary care provider associations, and people with lived experience (PWLE; i.e., people at risk of or with T1D, and their families and informal caregivers, or a patient organization representing these groups).

CIHR TEAM GRANT: INTERVENTION TRIAL IN INFLAMMATION FOR CHRONIC CONDITIONS 2023

The overall vision of this funding opportunity is to improve the health outcomes of people living with, or at risk of developing, chronic conditions by advancing the repurposing, development, and optimization of innovative interventions. Interventions are to target biological (e.g., genetic, epigenetic), environmental (e.g., exposure to chemical products, air pollution), social (e.g., socioeconomic status, education) and behavioral (e.g., tobacco or cannabis smoking, vaping, diet) triggers of shared pathways of inflammation across two or more chronic conditions. This funding opportunity is composed of two main types of grants: Research Team Grants and Knowledge Mobilization Hub (KM Hub)

CIHR CAFÉ SCIENTIFIQUE PROGRAM

Through this Café Scientifique funding opportunity, CIHR will provide funding for events, known as Cafés, that enable knowledge-sharing and open, respectful dialogues between the general public and health researchers on health-related issues of public interest.

Members of the public can engage with health researchers on their health research—related questions, learn about the research evidence, and contribute their views on future research directions. Health researchers can engage with the public on their work, communicate their research results, and gain a better understanding of what's important to Canadians. Knowledge users, Indigenous Knowledge Keepers, community partners, patients, and Person(s) With Lived/Living Experience (PWLLE) will have the opportunity to share their experiences participating in health research and using health research evidence.

CIHR INTENSIVE GRANT WRITING MASTERCLASS

The CIHR-IMHA Intensive Grant Writing Masterclass is designed to enhance the grant writing skills of early-career researchers whose work demonstrates relevance to the broad CIHR IMHA mandate. It is a series of six writing workshops delivered by Dr. Lorelei Lingard taking place over the course of Spring 2023 (in English only, although spots are reserved for Francophones). These workshops will support research leaders by developing writing skills, fostering writer identity, and strengthening the writing community.

Up to ten (10) spots to attend this event will be covered by IMHA. The selection process will be governed on the applicant's proficiency in writing as determined by a writing sample and Equity, Diversity and Inclusion (EDI) principles. Two of the ten spots will be reserved for francophone applicants who write grants and/or publish at least in part in English. Applicants chosen to attend the workshops will also be required to attend three additional 30-minute one-on-one coaching sessions with the workshop facilitator. Learn more.
