"patients who use drugs".
Many national patient organizations

Acknowledge sexand gender diversity?

Use gender-neutral language:

Learn about how <u>intersex</u> and <u>trans</u> <u>patients</u> experience the condition of interest.

Make inappropriate jokes or comments?

Ask a friend:

Comics, memes, photos, and jokes about weight, tattoos, substance use, sexual orientation, personality traits, and race are not funny.
