

Women's Health – Endocrinology & Obstetric Diagram

Pre-Admission

Type I & II Diabetes:
Obstetrician/Family Med Ob sends in Pre-Admit information to Admitting to create a Pre-Admit Encounter.

Type I & II Diabetes:
On Pre-Admit Encounter:
1/Endocrinologist enters desired orders on HOLD status with note to be released as required at time of delivery by Endocrinology on call Thus enabling Endo to directly enter own orders.
2/Also adds Endo Group as Care Provider. This allows patient to appear on Endo Group List, when they come into hospital.
3/Endo also enter's PP orders on HOLD status with note to 'Release Post Partum'

Gestational Diabetes:
These are largely patients of Family Med Obs who are currently sending in Pre-Admit information.

Gestational Diabetes:
Family Med or OB may enter Gestational Diabetic L&D orders on HOLD with note to 'Release on Admit L&D'

Admission

Type I & II Diabetes:
L&D Endo orders on HOLD are released by Endo as required.
NOTE: Insulin drips and other medication orders MUST be released by Endocrinology on call service.
If no orders by Endo then attending will put in an MD consult so pt on Endo list & Endo can enter orders

Gestational Diabetes:
Delivering Dr enters the appropriate Gestational Order Set. ie: Anit-partum, Labour & Delivery or Post-partum.
Endocrinology on call rarely needs to be notified, but if glycemic criteria met per Gest Order Sets then 'MD Consult' order is entered in SCM by Attending/Resident for Endocrinology on call to see patient in consult.

Type I & II Diabetes:
Endocrinology on call service enters PP orders on HOLD with note to 'Release Post Partum'. This can also be done on the Pre-Admit Encounter if desired orders known.

Gestational Diabetes: No Insulin Infusion
Attending/Resident will enter Gestational L&D order set.

Gestational Diabetes: with Insulin Infusion
If Insulin Drip required Endocrinology on call service enters orders into SCM.

Post Partum

Type I & II Diabetes:
PP Glucose Monitor & PP Insulin orders are to be released by Endo (or RN while on phone and reviewing with Endo)

Gestational Diabetes: No Insulin Infusion
Attending d/c's GDM L&D orders & enters GDM PP Orders into SCM. Endocrinology on call service need to be consulted ONLY if glycemic criteria met during PP period. Attending/resident will enter MD consult if required.

Gestational Diabetes: with Insulin Infusion
Endocrinology on call service need to be contacted ONLY if glycemic criteria met during PP period. Attending/resident will enter MD consult if required.

Type I & II Diabetes
Endocrinology on call service manage endocrinology orders during PP period.

Gestational Diabetes: with Insulin Infusion
Endocrinology on call service consulted if glycemic criteria met for their involvement PP. Endo on call service enter & manage their endocrinology orders during PP period
